

In order to report a video on YouTube on your phone, you'll need to **log in**.

If you'd like to report content in a video that you think breaks the law, under the video, tap the **report** flag (you may need to scroll across for this as it might not be visible at first).




Once you scroll down, you can select **Legal** issue.








You'll see this drop-down menu of categories representing different types of potentially illegal content. You can choose whatever reason most applies to the content you'd like to report, or you can choose **Other legal issue**.







Depending on the legal issue you'd like to report, the forms can vary. If you choose **Other legal issue**, you'll be brought to this illegal reporting form. Fill in your details.






Once you tap submit, you'll receive an automated response with a **reference number** that may look

like this.










After a few days, you'll receive an email letting you know the outcome of your report. If the platform agrees that the content is illegal, it will block visibility in the country you're in, and you may receive an email like this.

If the platform disagrees that the content is illegal, it will not remove the content and you will receive an email like this. You can **appeal** this decision.




Similar to reporting illegal content, under the video you'd like to report, tap the **report** flag. You may need to scroll across on your phone for this to be visible.








Select a category of harmful content from the drop-down list.








Depending on which category you choose, you may be prompted to fill in more details about your report, if you would like to do so.







Once you tap **report**, the video will immediately be reported. You'll get an automated response letting you know next steps.





You should receive a **confirmation email** that also provides a link to where you can track the progress of your report.


